Hazardous Chemicals

Certain chemicals are known to pose serious risks to human health and the environment. Certifications such as “Cradle to Cradle” and “Red List Free” have created their own lists of the most hazardous chemicals, and require that products seeking their certification are free of those listed chemicals.

Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs)

VOCs are organic chemicals that evaporate into the air at room temperature. They are emitted from products such as carpet, vinyl flooring, adhesives, paints, stains, composite wood products, upholstery foam, caulks, and sealants.

Some VOCs are known carcinogens, such as formaldehyde and benzene. The effects of VOCs may range from headaches, loss of coordination, and nausea to damage of the liver, kidney, and central nervous system. Concentrations of many VOCs are consistently higher indoors (up to ten times higher) than outdoors.
